Applying for an Age-Related Registration Number.

Applications for age-related registration numbers are made by the owner to the DVLA using supporting material provided by the AOMCC Machine Registrar.

Your initial step is to contact the Machine Registrar (registrar@arielownersmcc.com) with details of your machine – frame and engine numbers. The registrar will open a case, provide a case number and request a fee. Once payment has been made the registrar will prepare a suitable dating certificate from the factory records which will be authenticated and posted to the owner.

The owner should then send the following documents to the DVLA:

- An original wet-stamped dating certificate from the AOMCC machine registrar. Note the
 certificate must be used within 12 months of the date of issue. Applications using copies of
 certificates may be rejected by the DVLA.
- 2. Form V55/5 with the following sections completed:
 - 2. Insert "Historic Vehicle "
 - 6. Insert "Ariel "
 - 7. Insert the model (e.g.," KH" or "Arrow")
 - 8. Insert "Motorcycle"
 - 10. Insert the colour (e.g., "Maroon" or "Red/Black")
 - 25. Insert the year of manufacture
 - 31. Insert "Petrol"
 - 32 & 33. Ensure that you insert the Frame and Engine numbers actually on your machine rather than those on any paperwork you have.
 - 34. Insert the cubic capacity (e.g., "997cc")
 - 70. (Overleaf) Insert your name and address details
 - 71. Insert your date of birth
 - 72. Insert "Exempt by age"
 - Sign and date the Declaration at the bottom of the page.
- 3. The current DLVA fee for registering a vehicle which is £55.
- 4. Photocopy proof of personal identification. This is typically a DVLA Photocard driving licence.
- 5. For registrations to an address in Northern Ireland: A current Certificate of Insurance

Insurance certificates can be obtained using the frame number although the insurance may be valid only for a few weeks on this basis.

The V55/5 form is now available as a download from the DVLA website. If telephoning, you may find that the easiest option is to ask for the historic vehicle form pack which contains several forms but does include the V55/5.
